Propose 2.1	Location: Southern Roundabout Access, North Dane Way Summary: Lack of evident provision for pedestrians and cyclists. The proposals do not indicate the any additional pedestrian and cyclist facilities associated with the roundabout access junction, or connectivity to existing routes running parallel with North Dane Way. The lane widths of 3.0m in each direction indicated on the proposals give minimal width for cyclists and there would be pinch-points where central refuges accommodate footpath crossings. The existing footpath route, crossing North Dane Way, to the south of the proposed roundabout includes flights of steps on both sides of the highway corridor. This is an obstacle in access for mobility impaired users.	Recommendation: Review desire lines for pedestrians and cyclists in relation to the Southern Roundabout Access and incorporate facilities to provide connecting routes catering for all user groups wherever practicable.	Agree/Disagree: Agree - A public footpath crossing the fields to the east, is situated approximately 75m south of the roundabout and a footway connection has been provided to this location. A short, shared footway/cycleway to the north has also been provided with cyclists dismounting before crossing the splitter island and joining the existing footway along the western kerb edge of North Dane Way.
